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**Subject:-** Diversion of forest land for Budhal-Mahore-Gool road near Sungri from 30.50 Km to 31.25 Km and 33.825 Km to 34.425 Km.

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GOVERNMENT ORDER NO. 343, FST of 2004

D A T E : 05.08.2004

Sanction is accorded to the transfer of forest land measuring 3.24 Ha. of forest area falling in Compartment Nos 50 and 52/Oulabgash of Mahore Forest Division for construction of Budhal-Mahore-Gool road near Sungri from 30.50 to 31.25 Km and 33.825 to 34.425 Km by 110 RCC (GRR) on the following terms and conditions:-

1. The proprietary status of the forest land shall remain unchanged.
2. The forest land so diverted shall be utilized only for the purpose for which it has been diverted. It shall not be transferred to any other agency without approval of the Forest Department.
3. The forest land so diverted shall not be mortgaged, reassigned or sub-leased by user agency in any manner what-so-ever to any other agency.
4. The compensation for land on account of change of land use shall be paid by the user agency as may be assessed by Revenue Authorities. The CCF Jammu shall ensure that the assessment of land by Revenue Authorities is made at an earliest.
5. The user agency shall pay Rs. 3,39,353/- on account of compensatory for 132 number of trees @ two times of the standard rate of 1992.
6. The user agency shall pay Rs. 1,62,900/- on account of compensatory Afforestation to be carried out over 6.48 Ha. degraded forest land.
7. The user agency shall take all necessary measures to check soil erosion/land slides. In this regard, they shall seek technical guidance from the Director Soil Conservation Department, J&K Government.
8. The extraction of trees shall be done by SFC/Forest Deptt. on the basis of marking list duly approved by the Conservator of Forests, Working Plan Circle.
9. Any damage done to the forest by the user agency or its employees, contractors or people employed by them shall be charged from the user agency @ ten times the standard rate of 1992 as penalty.

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10. The forest land so diverted shall return to the Forest when it is no longer required by the user agency without any costs.
11. The user agency shall deposit the amount of compensation for the forest land diverted to be assessed by the Revenue Authorities, the Compensation for 132 trees felled and compensation for the damage done with the BFO, Mahara. However the cost of compensatory Afforestation shall be deposited with the Chief Accounts Officer in the office of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, J&K Govt. as per SRO 203 dated 13.04.2000.

The proposal stands cleared/approved by the Advisory Committee in its 26th Meeting under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary on 0.307.2004.
