Diversion of Forest Land for 400 KV D/C Transmission Line from Baghlihar to Kishanpur (Baghlihar HEP) by Power Development Corporation Jammu.

Sanction is accorded to the transfer of forest land measuring 87.251 Ha. out of which 33.654 Ha. of forest land falling in Comptts.4,5,6,7 and 8/J in Jindrah Range of Jammu Forest Division, 42.032 Ha. forest land falling in Comptts. 8,10,12 and 13/Bali and Co:No.63,66,67,68,69 and 73/Lander Block of Udhampur Forest Division and 11.565 Ha. of forest land falling in Comptt. No. 20,22a,22b,23a and 28/Batote of Batote Forest Division for 400 KV D/C Transmission line from Baghlihar to Kishanpur (Baghlihar HEP) on the following terms and conditions:-

1. The proprietary status of the forest land shall remain unchanged.
2. The forest land so diverted shall be utilized only for the purpose for which it has been diverted. It shall not be transferred to any other agency without approval of the Forest Department.
3. The forest land so diverted shall not be mortgaged, re-assigned or sub-leased by user agency in any manner what-so-ever to any other agency.
4. The user agency shall pay compensation of land on account of change of land use which shall be equivalent to the cost of land as assessed by Revenue Authorities.
5. The user agency shall pay compensation of trees to the extent of Rs.1,30,78,407/- @ two times of the standard rate of 1992.
6. The user agency will construct complete retaining/breast walls and take other necessary steps, wherever required so as to minimize soil erosion/land slides during execution of work.
7. The user agency shall pay Rs.23,38,133/- on account of compensatory afforestation to be carried over 170.502 Ha. of degraded forest land.
8. The extraction of trees shall be carried out by State Forest Corporation on the basis of marking list approved by Conservator of Forests, Working Plan and Research Circle.
9. Any damage caused to the forest by the user agency or its employees, contractors or people employed by them shall be charged from the user agency @ ten times the standard rate of 1992 as penalty.

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10. The user agency shall deposit the amount of compensatory afforestation in the office of the Principle Chief Conservator of Forests, J&K Govt. as per the SRO 203 dated 13.04.2000.

11. The forest land so diverted shall return to the Forest Department when it is no longer required by the user agency without any cost.

The proposal stands/cleared/approved by the Advisory Committee in its 25th meeting held on 09.02.2004 under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary.
