Subject :- Diversion of 34.20 Ha of Forest Land for four laning of NHIA Peerah-Karool sector, in Batote Forest Division by NHAI.

Reference: Cabinet Decision No. 89/7 dated 20.05.2008.

GOVERNMENT ORDER NO. 190 - FST OF 2008
D A T E D ; 27 - 05 - 2008

Sanction is accorded to diversion of forest land measuring 34.20 Ha falling under compartment Nos 22, 23, 28, 31/Batote, in Block Ramban, Range Batote, Batote Forest Division for four laning of NHIA Peerah-Karool sector by National Highways Authorities of India on the following terms and conditions:

1. The proprietary status of forest land shall remain unchanged.
2. The forest land so diverted shall be utilized only for the purpose for which it has been diverted. It shall not be transferred to any other agency without approval of the Forest Department.
3. The forest land so diverted shall not be mortgaged, reassigned or sub-leased by user agency in any manner what so ever to any other agency.
4. The User Agency shall pay Net Present Value of the forest land to the tune of Rs. 2,56,50,000/- (Rs. Two crore fifty-six lacs fifty thousand only) as calculated by the concerned DFO as per Hon'ble Supreme Court Order dated 30-10-2002 in I.A. No: 566 in Writ Petition (Civil) No: 202 of 1995 T.N. Godavarman Thirumalpad V/S Union of India.
5. The User Agency shall be bound to pay an amount of Rs. 41,07,338/- (Rs. Forty-one lacs seven thousand three hundred & thirty-eight only) on account of compensation of 10046 number of trees/poles of different species and dia classes.
6. The User Agency shall pay Rs. 20,52,000/- (Rs. Twenty lacs fifty-two thousand only) on account of compensatory afforestation to be carried over 68.40 ha.
7. The User Agency shall pay Rs. 45,90,000/- (Rs. Forty-five lacs ninety thousand only) on account of reconstruction of infrastructure, contingencies and overhead charges.
8. The extraction of trees shall be done by the SFC/Forest Department on the basis of markings technically sanctioned by Conservator of Forests, Working Plan Circle and administratively approved by the Chief Conservator of Forests, Jammu.
9. Any damage done to the forest by the user agency or its employees and contractors or people employed by them shall be charged from the user agency at the rate of ten times the standard rate of 1992.
10. The forest land so diverted shall return to the Forest Department free of any encumbrances when it is no longer required by the User Agency.
11. The user agency shall construct complete retaining/breast walls on the both sides of the road/railway line/earth work/tunneling etc., and take other necessary steps, so as to minimize soil erosion/land slips. In this regard, the user agency shall seek technical guidance from Director, Soil Conservation Department, J&K.
12. The user agency shall also pay any other amount which will become payable as per orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court or Government/Forest Department, J&K.
13. The user agency shall be responsible to get requisite clearance under any other relevant law in vogue.
14. The user agency shall submit an undertaking that in case of any upward revision of rates of Net Present Value, the user agency will pay the amount of differential Net Present Value.
15. The possession of Forest land diverted for non-forestry purpose under the orders of the competent authority, should not be handed over to the user agency till all

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payments due against Compensation of trees, NPV/Compensation of land Compensatory afforestation costs etc are deposited with Chief Accounts Officer in the office of the PCCF. Before handing over the possession of the Forest land it should be further ensured that there are no outstanding dues with the said User Agency in respect of the cases sanctioned in the past.

16. The User Agency shall prepare a comprehensive Environment Management Plan with special emphasis on debris/muck disposal in respect of diversion cases sanctioned in the past or to be processed in future. This plan should be approved by the Forest Department.

The proposal stands cleared/ approved by the Advisory Committee in its 41st meeting held under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary on 25th February, 2008.
