Besides 40035 trees/poles/saplings, 35322 bushes are also involved Out of 40035 trees/poles/saplings, approximately 9953 number of Tree/Pole/Sapling are expected to be felled. Actual number of trees would be assessed during marking as per the marking rules prescribed in terms and conditions.

2. The proprietary and legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged.

3. The forest land shall be utilized only for the purpose for which it has been indented, that too under close supervision and periodical spot inspection of the concerned Forest Department Officers. The reports of the concerned DCF shall be submitted to the FAC Cell in the office of Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, J&K with copies to the Administrative Department.

4. The forest land shall not be mortgaged, reassigned, leased or sub-leased by user agency in any manner whatsoever to any other agency.

5. The user Agency has made the payment in full of the amount summarized below, as reported by the Nodal Officer FCA, vide letter mentioned at Ref(.iii).

6. Construction, if any, approved in the proposal, will be allowed on forest land only after Government sanction is issued.

7. The extraction of the trees /poles shall be done by the State Porest Corporation/Divisional Forest Officer concerned on the basis of markings administratively approved by the Clief Conservator of Forests, Jammu/ Kashmir. The cost of extraction and transportation shall be paid by the User Agency directly to the agency executing the extraction.

8. Extraction shall be done as per guidelines prescribed by the Ministry of Environment and Forests vide its no. F.No. 7-25/2012-FC dated 5th May 2014, which has been formulated in consultation with the Central Electricity Authority. Extraction will be carried out in following steps:

(i) Marking list for felling of trees will be prepared by the local forest officer (DFO concerned) for the felling of trees coming in the alignment of foundation of towers and along the strip, as per requirement of the User Agency. Fundamental rule for the marking will be to save maximum number of trees without compromising with the

construction and maintenance of the transmission line.

(ii) Forest area required for foundation of the towers and three meter strip below each conductor bundle, which would be marked by the User Agency on the ground, will be cleared first. Trees on this area will be felled, but after stringing work is completed, natural regeneration will be allowed to come up. Felling/ pollarding/ pruning of trees will be done with the permission of the DFO concerned wherever necessary to maintain the electrical clearance. One outer strip will be left clear to permit maintenance of transmission line.

(iii) During construction of transmission line, pollarding/ pruning of trees located outside the width (three mt) of the strips, whose branches/parts infringe with conductor string, shall be permitted to the extent necessary, as may be decided by the local forest officer.

(iv) Pruning of trees for taking construction/ stringing equipments through existing approach/ access routes in forest areas shall also be permitted to the extent necessary, as may be decided by the local forest officer. Construction of new approach/ access route will however, require prior approval under the Act.

(v) In the remaining width of right of way, trees will be felled or lopped to the extent required, for preventing electrical hazards by maintaining 5.5 meter of minimum

clearance between conductor and trees.

(vi) To avoid any hazard, felling/cutting/pruning of those trees which because of their height/ location may fall on conductors shall also be permitted, as may be decided by the local forest officer.

(vii) In the case of transmission lines to be constructed in hilly areas, where adequate clearance is already available, trees will not be cut except those minimum required to be

cut for stringing of conductors.

9. Plantation of shrubs /bushes and small size tree species will be done all along the Transmission line on forest land. A separate project would be prepared by the Forest Department in consultation with the User Agency for the purpose which would be funded by the User Agency. Plantation will be done after the stringing of conductor has been completed.

10. The User Agency shall construct retaining walls/breast walls on forest land and take all necessary steps to check soil erosion which may result due to proposed construction of the line in consultation with the Soil Conservation Department. The Forest Department shall take due cognizance under law for any laxity on this account on the part of the User Agency which might trigger soil crosion in the area.

11. Any damage done to the forest by the User Agency or its employees and confuetors or people employed by them shall be charged from the User Agency @ 10 times the

standard rate of 1992.

12. The forest land so allowed for use shall return to the Forest Department free of any encumbrances when it is no longer required by the User Agency.

13. The User Agency shall be responsible for obtaining requisite clearances under any other

law in vogue before commissioning of the project.

14. The sanction will remain valid for one year.
