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Muck disposal Plan:

Quantity of muck proposed to be disposed off on the forest land is 17638 cubic meters for which one dumping site has been identified on the forest land involving 0.65 Ha.

Details of protection work:

The User Agency shall do the following crate works on the dumping sites involved:

- i. Protection work to retain Nallah: Crates (LxBxH) = $2 \times (30 \times 1.25 \times 1.25) = 93.75 \text{ CuM}$
 - ii. Protection work for dumping area: Crates (LxBxH) = 4062.5 CuM
- Besides, stone pitching work for side slopes at various excavation spots, wherever required, is also proposed.


Terms and Conditions applicable

1. The proprietary and legal status of forest land shall remain unchanged.
2. The forest land shall be utilized only for the purpose for which it has been indented, that too under close supervision and periodical spot inspection of the concerned Forest Department Officers. The report of the concerned DCF shall be submitted to the FAC Cell in the Office of Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, J&K, with copies to the Administrative Department.
3. The forest land shall not be mortgaged, reassigned, leased or sub-leased by user agency in any manner what so ever to any other agency.
4. The user agency has made the payment in full of the amount summarized below, as reported by PCCF, vide letter mentioned at Ref. (iii) :

5. Construction, if any approved in the proposal, will be allowed on forest land only after payment of amount summarized above to the Forest Department and Govt. sanction is issued in the case.
6. The User Agency and / or its contractors will not bring any forest area under their use, other than the actual area/ activity approved by the Government for the instant proposal. Any laxity or deviation on this account by the user agency or its contractors will attract penal provisions of the relevant Acts/ legal provisions.
7. The User Agency shall pay the additional amount of NPV, if so determined, as per decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. , ' .
8. The User Agency will install fish screen at weir site or at fore bay site.
9. (i) The extraction of the trees/ poles shall be done by the State Forest Corporation/ Divisional Forest Officer concerned on the basis of markings administratively approved by the Chief Conservator of Forests, Kashmir. The marking for tree-felling will be done in consultation with the User Agency and effort shall be made to save maximum number of trees. The cost of extraction and transportation shall be paid by the User Agency directly to the agency executing the extraction.

(ii) The fundamental rule for marking of trees, enumerated during processing of the instant proposal, will be to save maximum number of trees without compromising with the construction and maintenance of the approved project structures and no trees will be felled/ cut/ pruned/ lopped for purposes/ project activities other than those approved/ sanctioned.
10. The User Agency shall construct retaining walls/ breast walls on forest land and take all necessary steps to check soil erosion which may result due to proposed construction of the road in consultation with the Soil Conservation Department.
11. The User Agency shall construct retaining walls/breast walls on forest land and take all necessary steps to check soil erosion which may result due to proposed construction of the road in consultation with the Soil Conservation Department. The Forest Department shall take due cognizance under law for any laxity on this account on the part of the User Agency which might trigger soil erosion in the area.
12. The User Agency shall be responsible for the eco-restoration of the muck dumping sites identified on forest land through engineering and biological means.
13. Any damage done to the forest by the User Agency or its employees and contractors or people employed by them shall be charged from the User Agency @ 10 times the standard rate of 1992.
14. The forest land so allowed for use shall return to the Forest Department free of any encumbrances when it is no longer required by the User Agency.
15. The User Agency shall be responsible for obtaining requisite clearances under any other law in vogue before commissioning of the project.



16. At least 15% discharge shall be allowed in the stream round the year and there will be no violation of irrigation rights of the local farmers.

17. The sanction will remain valid for one year.
